When it came to advice for making the journey, there were references to the right foods, equipment, maps, and strategies, but in the end the essential was all about relationships and rediscovering an old friendship. The point was not the Trail's destination – it was the journey – the time to reflect, renew, and remember what's really important in life. We may never walk the Appalachian Trail, but we are all on this journey called Life. Old Business

- Car Stop Repairs – Three were replaced. Orange and white paint has been purchased and they will be painted by the youth of the church. Blue and red paint needs to be purchased for painting of names on some of the car stops.
- Sprinklers Repairs – They were replaced and repaired.
- AT&T Phone – iPhone 4S was purchased by Susie Greiff.
- Pastor Bathroom – All repairs were completed to the Pastor's bathroom. Thanks to Jim Eagan for the great job.
- Replacement of West Property Pine Tree – Tree was replaced to meet the city requirements. The tree is dying. Rich Thole will research a tree that does not require a lot of water.
- Clavinova Keyboard – All repairs have been completed.

DEACONS CORNER



Here's a question for everyone – Does the church need to change to keep up with the needs of a changing people or do people need to stop changing and go back to the ways of a more traditional church? There are many opinions about this but one thing is for sure, the trend is for more and more people to not attend a church service. A recent study reveals startling results. 25 years ago 91% of the U.S. population called itself Christian. Today in 2015, the number has shrunk to 70%. 30% of the population is non-Christian but worse over 20% don't identify themselves with any religion at all. This is a very serious and damaging trend. We can see the effects of this in our society where families are losing their core and children are being raised without the spiritual education that will carry them through life's challenges. This lack of "core spiritual belief" is causing much devastating damage to society as a whole as we see crime, disrespect of others, lawsuits, and a general distrust of others lead to open conflict between neighbors, friends and relatives. The church as a whole is struggling to find its continued meaningful place by changing to what it believes is what the people want to see. But, what if this is the wrong thing for the church to do? What if the church's changing is really accelerating us as a people down the wrong road? What if we go back to a more traditional approach, where Jesus is speaking again and teaching us his simple lessons? What if we could drop all the layers of man-made tradition and the "let's try this next" approach for the one that allows Jesus to do the talking? Think about it? Are we here in this physical world to celebrate just our lives and getting through the day, week, month or year? Or, are we here to make the most of the talents that God gave to us and to celebrate the fact that Jesus has given us a path to make the most of our physical lives while giving us knowledge that we are going to be with him again when this life ends? The overall church is struggling as we can see by the Pope's recent visit to realign the Catholic Church. Our own church here in Port Orange is looking at ways we can stay relevant and grow. Yet, we are feeling the pull for change. But, is changing what we need? We are a very healthy church with great people and a meaningful place in our community. Do we need to do more of what we have been doing or do we need to make changes like we see other churches making? Are we here to celebrate the church as a body or are we here to celebrate the message Jesus left us? Do we go back to basics or do we make changes? Are we running away from the very thing we need to be doing? *Bob Brewster, Chair of Deacons*

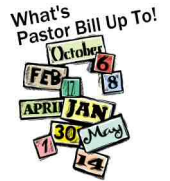


NEWS & NOTES

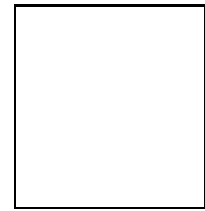

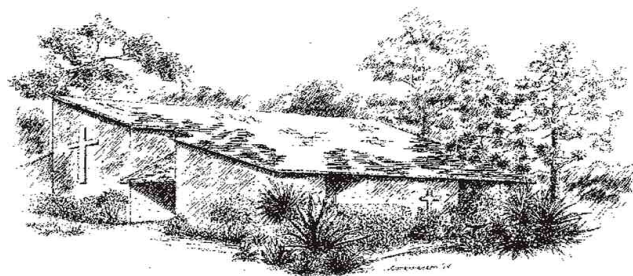
